From Father:

Christ is in our midst!

Controversial subjects. They seem to be everywhere today. It is nearly impossible not to be embroiled in these subjects, and to be forced to reckon with your own attitude and thoughts surrounding them. What is our response as Orthodox Christians? Do the teachings of the Church need to change, or be updated? Is the Church too archaic in its rationale regarding these subjects?

The first thing I always remember is that the Church has always existed in the midst of controversy. In fact, none of the controversies we face today are new, they are simply cloaked in new rhetoric and modern arguments.

The question really becomes, do we have faith that what the Church teaches is true? The Church is a divine institution—it is the body of Christ. It is also a human institution—we are members of the body of Christ. In that sense, the Church has always expressed its beliefs and teachings through human language and our capacity for understanding.

It may be tempting to go along with every new idea about human psychology and sociology. There is no harm in looking into the arguments. But we rely firmly on the teaching of the Church, which is nothing less than the divine revelation of God to us. So, the ultimate question is, to whom do we submit? The spirit of the age, or the Church?
